Los Angeles Harbor's hard working fishing fleet—tops in the nation—and thousands of rugged fishermen are beginning to clear the decks in preparation for their annual celebration, the picturesque San Pedro Fishermen's Fiesta, Sept. 15-16.

Secret conferences are being held aboard fishing boats as skippers and crews plan the colorful decorations which will transform plain-looking fishing boats into fairyland floats for the spectacular boat parade which climaxes the Fiesta.

A record number of entries is expected this year, with more than 100 purse seiners and tuna clippers planning to enter the parade. In addition to the fun and excitement of the parade, the fishing fleet is vying for cash prizes and trophies for decorating their vessels on the Fiesta theme, "The Sea Around Us."

The pageant will be officially launched Sept. 8 when fishermen will put aside their nets and lines to witness the coronation of their pretty Skipperette, 18-year-old Nancy Harris, of San Pedro. Her official installation will take place at a Coronation Ball at the San Pedro Elks Lodge, Dr. Elton C. Spires, Fiesta general chairman, will crown Miss Harris and her two mates, Ann De Meglio, 18, and Jeannette Grady, 19.


