## John's Word Named Topic

"The hour is coming, and now is, when the dead shall hear the voice of the Son of God; and they that hear shall live." These words are the Apostle John (5:25) are the Golden Text and keynote of the Lesson-Sermon on "Probation after Death" in all Christian Science churches on Sunday.

After passages from the Bible telling of the crucifixion of Jesus and of his triumph over the grave, these verses from the beginning of The Acts of the Apostles are given, "The former treatise have I made, ... of all that Jesus began both to do and teach. Until the day in which He was taken up, after that He through the Holy Ghost had given commandments unto the apostles whom He had chosen: To whom also He shewed Himself alive after His passion by many infallible

proofs, being seen of them 40 days, and speaking of the things pertaining to the kingdom of God" (1:1-3).

In a correlative passage Mary Baker Eddy is quoted from "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures," "Jesus' unchanged physical condition after what seemed to be death was followed by His exaltation above all material conditions; and this exaltation explained His ascension, and revealed unmistakably a probationary and progressive state beyond the grave" (p. 46).

plants. To deprive any form of life of the "breath" or "spirit" results in death. The first thing a baby does is to breathe air into the lungs. The last thing a man does is to breathe air out of the lungs. Ps. 146:4.

**"SOUL"**

What happens to the "soul" at death? Will you tell me what happens to the "light" when we separate the electricity from the frame-work that little form. After the good-night kiss the little one falls asleep. Though unconscious in its sweet rest the child is not forgotten by the mother until it awakens. So it is with those who sleep in Jesus. They know no grief nor joy. Centuries pass in the twinkling of an eye. They said "good-bye" and fall asleep in Jesus.
