Tastiest morsel of the classical album month is RCA Victor's "Massenet: Manon," an opera in five acts featuring the sensational voices of Victoria de Los Angeles as Manon, Henry Legay as Chevalier des Grieux, and Jean Borghy as Count des Grieux. Conducting the chorus and orchestra of the Theatre National de l'Opera Comique is Paris-born Pierre Monteux. This startling album comes complete with four long-play records and a French-English libretto.

"War and Peace" is a brilliant long-play album by Columbia Records directly from the sound track of Paramount's emotional motion picture. The majestic sweep of the movie is expertly converted to the album and its musical stature proves equal to the visual effect of the film.

"Here's Lookin' At You," by Sammy Davis, Jr., is just what they're calling Sammy—Mr. Wonderful! This Decca album merely further proves that Sammy is uncanny in everything he does. His range of vocal and dramatic effects is absolutely incredible but true.

Mercury Records offers Paul Paray conducting the Detroit Symphony Orchestra in a fitting tribute to Claude Debussy, including: "Prelude to the Afternoon of a Faun," "Iberia—Images for Orchestra, No. 2," and "La Mer (The Sea)—Three Symphonic Sketches." This album is a Living Presence recording by one of the greatest 20th Century French conductors.

Capitol's top pop singles of the week are... A velvety "Repeat After Me" by Gordon Jenkins... Merrill Moore's bombastic and rollicking "Gotta Gimme Whatcha Got"... Luciano Virgili's thrilling voice on "To Live" (Vivere)... Nat "King" Cole's holiday-spiced "Take Me Back to Toyland," and "The Little Boy That Santa Claus Forgot"... A swaying, rhythmic "Farmer's Tango" by Nelson Riddle... and Trudy Richards' super chirping of the dramatic "Once Upon a Dream."

"Puccini: La Boheme" is the first full-length recording of an opera ever made in this country by Sir Thomas Beecham. No wonder that RCA Victor Records is bragging it is also the first Puccini opera that Beecham has ever recorded. Miml is sung by Victoria de Los Angeles, Rudolfo by Jussi Boelinger and Marcello by Robert Merrill. As Sir Thomas sums it up: "This is one of the most perfect operas—not a note too much, nor a bar too much—each act is marvelously constructed and the length is ideal."

Alfred Newman and his orchestra plays "Love Dreams," a Decca album collection of some of the loveliest, most memorable dream melodies in the annals of music. Included are some such as: Debussy's "Clair de Lune," Liszt's "Liebestraum," Beethoven's "Moonlight Sonata," Kreisler's "The Old Refrain," and Chopin's "Prelude."

"Jan Peerce Sings Hebrew Melodies," on RCA Victor, shows this memorable album portrays the inherited melodic tracings from the early Hebrew sacred song. Included are "Nol Nidrei," "Eili, Eili," "Glock," "Meyerke, Mein Zun," et al. And Mr. Peerce's glorious voice marks this one for your eternity shelf.

Commission Gives Tract Tentative OK

The Torrance Planning Commission Wednesday night recommended for approval a proposed housing tract at 166th and Arlington Ave. with the stipulation that no work be started on the 59 proposed houses for 90 days.

This provision was made to determine whether the Torrance School Board wants part of the land for a new school building. The Commission was informed that the local educators are starting condemnation proceedings against the land.

After considerable debate, the planners, by a 6-1 margin, decided to approve the tract with a delay on start of construction in order to give the school board time to file condemnation proceedings against the property if it wants to.


