World Tour Experiences Recalled By Librarian

Miss Helen Rodgers, head librarian of El Camino College, addressed members of the School Library Assn. of California, as that group convened at the Bakersfield Inn last week. Her topic was "A Librarian in Japan."

Background for Miss Rodgers' speech stems from her experience as a librarian in Japan during the school year, 1955-56.

One of Miss Rodgers' primary objectives during her stay in Japan was the organization of a high school library in Yokohama, where she served on the faculty of Yokohama High School in the American Dependents' School, sponsored by the U. S. Army for education of the children of American Security Forces in Japan.

Headed Cultural Exchange. Miss Rodgers also served as the program chairman for the Inter-cultural Data Exchange Committee of Yokohama, which is composed of Japanese teachers of English and the American teachers in Yokohama.

Japan has a high literacy rate as a result of the law requiring all children to attend school, which is conducted five and a half days a week, with two years of English required of a high school graduate, Miss Rodgers reported. An important part of school training for the children is touring their

After nine months in Japan, Miss Rodgers started her trip homeward late in June. Points of interest en route included Manila, Bataan and Corregidor.

After a short tour of Manila, she journeyed on to Cebu and Singapore, the main stop for shipping lines in the Orient.

During her first four days there, she visited the Tiger Balm Gardens, Jade collection and the Botanical Gardens.

Encountered Monsoon. "From Singapore we went to Port Swettenham, Penang, and Colombo," Miss Rodgers recalled. "In the Arabian seas, we encountered the worst southwest monsoon in 30 years."

Heading for Port Said and Italy, the ship eventually made its principal stop in Genoa. There Miss Rodgers visited the Riviera.

Nasser Took Canal. Passage through the Suez Canal was especially interesting, since Nasser took the possession of it the day the ship passed through.

Closing the tour with Marseilles, France, and Rotterdam, Holland, Miss Rodgers boarded the M.S. Berlin for the United States in mid-August.

Arriving in Los Angeles the latter part of the month—exactly a year and two weeks after her stateside departure on sabbatical leave—Miss Rodgers summarized her trip by stating, "It was a wonderful year filled with interesting experiences and memories which will last for many years."
