Tartars Lose In Pre-Tourney Tilt

In a final prep before the Long Beach tournament opener, with Long Beach Wilson Tartar five lost a 56-52 decision to Downey High on the winner's court.

The locals lost the match from mid-court, as the Downey sharpshooters sank 26 out of 28 long shots attempted.

The Tartars' 6'4" center, Rich Ruffell, led the local scoring with 19 points. Gene Crenshaw came through with 14, while Jerry Mathews hit for 11.

Brief Rally

A brief Torrancia rally in the third quarter, brought the Tartars even with Downey, but they were unable to keep the drive going and fell be-

hind in the final period.

The local junior varsity also tasted defeat, dropping to the Downey juniors 49-44 in an overtime contest before the varsity go.

High Point

Mike Bertollet led the local JV's with 10 tallies; Lee Day scored 9, while Mick Babbitt and Tony Venable got on the score board with 8 points apiece.

The Downey loss gives the locals an even split in the first two games this season. Torrancia action for the next two weeks will be confined to tournament play, the current Long Beach tourney, and the Pacific Shores tournament starting Dec. 5.

Torrance Cross Country Crew Second ni Loop

All told, a quarter of a million fingerlings and 60,000 catchable-size rainbows withheld from the lake's unused 1956 planting allotment will be added to Big Bear's regular 1957 allotment of catchables.

New Aviation Plan Started

A brand new Marine Corps enlistment program has just been announced by Headquarters, 12th Marine Corps Reserve and Recruitment District here.

For the first time, Marine recruiters are now authorized to enlist qualified applicants for specific assignment to aviation technical schools following completion of recruit and advanced individual training.

Assignment Guaranteed

According to Col. Russell E. Honsowetz, deputy director of the Reserve and Recruitment District, the directive establishing the new program provides that a guarantee of assignment to aviation school will be entered in the service record of each Marine found qualified and enlisted for such schooling.

The aviation Marines will complete recruit training at the San Diego Marine Corps Recruit Depot, and undergo the four weeks' advanced training at Camp Pendleton.

However, instead of then being assigned to an infantry, artillery, ship's detachment or other unit, they will receive orders directing them to report to an aviation technical school following 15 days leave.

29 Schools Offered

Marines enlisted under the aviation schooling program will be assigned to one of more than 29 schools, according to individual qualifications and interests. The schools cover maintenance, repair and operation in jets, helicopter and conventional engines, and in aviation ordinance, radio, radar, fire control, training devices, traffic control, guided missile, photography, aerology and electrical fields.
