
Entertainers Scheduled at Marineland

TV Writer To Discuss Comedy Plots

Southwest Manuscripters will have an opportunity to hear a well-known television writer at their May 17 meeting when Arthur Julian will be guest speaker.
 Julian started his writing career while in the Air Force during World War II, doing shows and newspaper articles both in the States and in Burma, China and India.
 After the war he began writing for radio, doing mainly comedy series, among them the "Beulah" show starring Hattie McDaniel.
 Then came television and he was connected with the "Meet Millie" show both as a writer and eventually supervisor of scripts.
 Writes Screenplay
 While in Paris Julian created, wrote and produced a TV pilot film, "My American Wife," which was financed by NBC. At that time he also wrote in collaboration an original screenplay called "The Happy Road." This movie stars Gene Kelly and will be released soon.
 Julian recently sold an original teleplay to Playhouse 90 which will be produced next season. Currently he is preparing several TV pilot scripts and writing free lance half-hour shows for Schlitz Theatre.
 To Discuss Comedy
 For the subject of his talk to the Manuscripters Julian has chosen "Comedy in TV." With producers, as well as audiences, bemoaning the lack of good comedy in TV, this talk should be most opportune. A large attendance is expected at this coming meeting, according to Dorothy Boesch, co-program chairman.
 The Southwest Manuscripters meet every third Friday of the month at 8 p.m. at Clark Stadium, Hermosa Beach.
