County to Develop 18-Hole Golf Course Near Torrance

Acquisition of 204 acres of Carson property for development as an 18-hole "Tournament" golf course and regional park has been approved by the County Board of Supervisors, on the recommendation of Supervisor Burton W. Chace.

The Board ordered its clerk, Gordon Nesvig, to advertise the County's intention to purchase the property from its owners, Dominguez Estates Co.

The site is abounded on the north by 189th St., on the west by Main St., on the east by Avalon Blvd. and on the south by the Dominguez Channel and Edison Co. right-of-way.

Supervisor Kenneth Hahn, whose district lies just north of the site, supported the acquisition, agreeing with Chace that there is a "dire need in this area for this type of development."

According to Chace, improvements to be constructed in a five-year development program include the 6500-yard, 18-hole course, complete club house, driving range, and putting green facilities.

Also slated for construction is an extensive area, child play areas and a giant athletic field having three ball diamonds with an overlying football-soccer field. The field will also have facilities for night soft-ball play.

The ambitious five-year program anticipates also the construction of a swimming pool and sportatorium having multi-purpose rooms for community use as well as gymnasium facilities for industrial and league competition.

First priority for construction, according to Norman Johnson, director of the County's Park and Recreation Dept., will be awarded to the golf course and clubhouse facilities, because these are revenue producing and will help finance the remainder of the project.
