N. American To Help on Missiles

North American Aviation's Los Angeles Division has been given a role in the nation's intercontinental ballistic missile program with the announcement today by the Martin Co. that a subcontract has been awarded for the construction of ground equipment for the Titan missile.

General Manager Ray Rice said work will begin immediately on the transtainer units—large aluminum trailer-like bodies—which will be used to transport and contain the Titan on the ground.

The Titan is one of two intercontinental ballistic missiles under development by the U. S. Air Force. It will be capable of delivering a thermonuclear warhead to a target 5000 miles away. Responsibility for the production and initial operation of the Titan rests with the Western Development Division here in Inglewood under the command of Maj. Gen. Bernard A. Schriever. Martin will build the missile at its new Denver, Colo., division.

Engines for the other Air Force ballistic missile, the Atlas, are being produced by another North American division, Rocketdyne.

Class to Offer Aid in Planning

Planning for the new baby is the subject to be discussed at the first of the expectant parents' classes starting Thursday, June 13 at 1 p.m., in the Torrance Health Center, 2300 Carson St., according to Dr. B. A. Kogan, District Health Officer.

Educational material is offered to prospective mothers in the care of herself before the baby arrives and the care of the new infant. Information given is educational in nature and does not in any way take the place of early and regular prenatal medical attention by physicians, the Health Officer said.

Subjects to be discussed include layette needs, health during pregnancy, nutrition, baby's growth, formula preparation, and baby bath technique. Motion pictures will also be shown at several of the sessions, Dr. Kogan said. The film, "Human Growth" is scheduled for the first class.

Miss Janice Hopkins, who has served as public health nurse-instructor in the past, will continue in this assignment.

The classes will be held every Thursday at 1 p.m., and prospective mothers are invited. There is no registration or other fee as this is a tax-supported service of the Los Angeles County Health Department.
