Area 18 (bordered by Sepulveda, Crenshaw, Hawthorne, and Lomita Blvd.)—No recommendations at this time, although further residential development might require a park.

Area 19 (bordered by Crenshaw, Sepulveda, Western, and south city limits)—Recommended appraisal of 10 acres between 231st and 236th Sts., between Eshelman and Arlington.

Area 20 (bordered by Calle Mayor, Pacific Coast Hwy., and the ocean)—No recommendations, because of no available land.

Area 21 (bordered by Calle Mayor, Pacific Coast Hwy., Wilmington St., and south city limits)—No recommendations.

Area 22 (Torrance Airport)—Recommended appraisal of land at southeast corner of Lomita and Crenshaw.

Area 23 (bordered by Pacific Coast Hwy., Wilmington St., Rolling Hills Rd., and south city limits)—Appraisal of 13 acres on Madison St., south of Newton, recommended.

Area 24 (bordered by Pacific Coast Hwy., Rolling Hills Rd., and south and west city limits)—No action, although study of mining property ordered for possible site.

Scarlet Fever Usually Disease Of Childhood; Death Rate Low

Scarlet fever is usually a disease of childhood, although adults who have never had the disease may get it if exposed to the infection.

The official mortality rate is low and the deaths that do occur from this or any other streptococcal infection generally result from the complications that develop in the course of illness.

The chief difference between scarlet fever and other strep throat infections is that in the former a scarlet rash appears on parts of the body. The rash is colorful evidence that the bacteria are either potent toxin producers or that

the patient has no immunity to the poison.

Build up Resistance
Most often, however, by the time adulthood is reached, the average person has built up resistance to the toxins produced by the hemolytic streptococcal strains that cause the disorders now grouped under strep infections.

As the individual becomes older, therefore, the less likely he is to get the rash when suffering from a strep throat.

Only those persons still susceptible to the toxins break out with the scarlatinal rash. To sum it up briefly: should two persons be infected with the same strain of streptococcus one may become ill with

what is called a strep throat while the other, susceptible to the toxin, may develop a sore throat and a rash as well.

Infection Spreads
The bacteria that cause strep infections pass from person to person through nasal and throat discharges, or the infection may also be spread by means of contaminated objects. Furthermore, healthy persons are sometimes carriers of streptococci that may cause acute illness in another individual.

All strep infections can be extremely serious, particularly if treatment is neglected. Formidable complications that can follow the initial infection include mastoid infection, rheu-

matic fever and nephritis.

Wonder-Working Drugs
Luckily, the antibiotic drugs are indeed wonder-working in the treatment of strep infections. Penicillin, for instance, is practically a specific for scarlet fever and this means that it is usually a quick and sure remedy. It reduces the patient's temperature to normal and eliminates the rash in about four days.

So efficient is modern treatment considered that immunization against scarlet fever is generally considered impractical, and the Dick test for susceptibility to the disease is rarely employed.

Seek Care
Nonetheless, in any strep

infection, negligence in seeking prompt medical care in the first stages of illness or the withdrawal of medical treatment or nursing care because of rapid recovery after treatment is to gamble with health or even, in some cases, with life itself.
