**Ens. Donald Mitchell Claims

Expected to arrive in Torrance the first of July are Ensign and Mrs. Donald Leslie Mitchell whose wedding was a beautiful event at the United States Naval Academy Chapel in Annapolis, Md. on July 8, the day following Ens. Mitchell's graduation from the Naval Academy. Mrs. Mitchell is the former Miss Ruth Robin Gensley, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John F. Gensley, Jr., of Hermosa Beach. The bridegroom is the son

of Mr. and Mrs. Herman L. Mitchell, 1317 Acacia Ave., who returned home Tuesday from Annapolis where they attended their son's graduation and wedding.

The newlyweds are now on an extensive honeymoon through New York State, Canada and across the continent. They will establish a Long Beach home since Ens. Mitchell has been assigned to the USS Mansfield in Long Beach.

The new Mrs. Mitchell was graduated from Redondo High school and El Camino College. She was a 1935 graduate of UCLA and for the past two years has been doing graduate work at the American University in Washington, D. C. She was affiliated with Chi Theta Chi at El Camino.

Ens. Mitchell was graduated from Torrance High School and El Camino College. On June 7, he completed four years at the United States Naval Academy receiving his BS degree and his Ensign commission in the United States Navy.

Bello, Episcopal minister officiated at the formal 1 o'clock military wedding for which the bride wore a pink original gown of silk organza ornamented with lace applique on the skirt and bodice. Antonio P. R. Calerco of Chico was the best man and ushers were David Van Capp, Edward Downey, Jr., and Richard Steyer.


Mrs. Ralph George of Torrance, soloist, was accompanied by Miss T. Hau, organist.
