# Registration Set June 28

Registration for the six weeks' summer session at Harbor Junior College will be held on Friday, June 28, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m., and from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m., according to J. Reburn Hatfield, dean of summer session.

All courses are tuition-free, carry regular college credit, and will be offered during the hours from 8 a.m. to 10 p.m., Mondays through Fridays. No admission tests or transcripts are required for summer session attendance. Any person who is a high school graduate, or is 18 years of age or older may attend.

Over 75 courses are being offered in the seven divisions of the college. Included among them are such courses as business mathematics, calculating machines, printing, engine technology, typewriting, architectural drawing, elementary algebra, plane geometry, slide rule, drawing and painting, English fundamentals, speed

reading, public speaking, theater arts, health education, chemistry, physics, general psychology, political and social history of the United States, and many others.

Counselors will help students plan their programs during registration and will be available during the entire summer session. Recreational equipment and facilities will be provided, and picnics and outings are planned.
