

### Sunday Topic To Consider Atomic Force

"Is the Universe, Including Man, Evolved by Atomic Force?" This challenging question is the subject of the Lesson-Sermon in the Christian Science churches today.

A quotation in the sermon taken from "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures" by Mary Baker Eddy in connection with forces and their structures says, "We tread on forces. Withdraw them, and creation must collapse. Human knowledge calls them forces of matter; but divine Science declares that they belong wholly to divine Mind, are inherent in this Mind, and so restores them to their rightful home and classification" (p. 124).

A passage from the Bible relates Matthew's account of Jesus' stilling the tempest, "His disciples came to him, and awoke him, saying, Lord, save us: we perish . . . Then he arose, and rebuked the winds and the sea; and there was a great calm" (8:25, 26).

The Golden Text is from John's Gospel (1:1, 3), "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. . . All things were made by him; and without him was not any thing made that was made."
