\$380,352 total spent for USO
This amount represents approximately 40c per month for each of the 75,000 Los Angeles men and women now in the armed forces.

SERVICES were provided in 22 USO Overseas Clubs throughout the world and more than 202 clubs within the United States.

SERVICES were given to more than 700,000 men and women visiting the Los Angeles area through the following: USO-Hollywood and YWCA Clubs; USO-JWB Club (Jewish Welfare Board); USO-Los Angeles Committee; USO-NCCS Club (National Catholic Community Service); USO-Salvation Army Club; USO-Travelers Aid Society of Los Angeles; USO-YMCA-28th Street Club and USO-YMCA (San Pedro).

USO CAMP SHOWS entertained a large military audience. Remember, one million of our men and women in military service are under 21 and away from home for the first time.

COMMUNITY PLANNING CUTS WASTE AND ASSURES EFFICIENCY

WELFARE PLANNING COUNCIL, LOS ANGELES REGION — \$290,540

Brings together more than 200 public and private agencies and other interested community groups to share knowledge and plan together for greater efficiency and quality of service; to promote cooperation and coordination, to meet gaps in needed services, to avoid duplication, and help develop a better community. This work is accomplished chiefly through four divisions: Child Welfare, Family and Adult Services, Health, and Youth Services—and through special Board committees, all subject to Board of Directors' direction and approval. In addition, there are the following services:

AREA PLANNING: Provides staff service to five closely affiliated Area Councils — Harbor, San Fernando Valley, West, South Central and East Central, as a means of decentralizing planning program.


CAMP BUREAU: Extends community planning and improvement for camping for all age groups and disseminates information of all kinds related to camping.

RESEARCH DEPARTMENT: Provides basic research data and consultation for Planning Council committees, Welfare Federation and community agencies; designs and carries out studies of needs and services.

VOLUNTEER BUREAU: Stimulates, recruits and places volunteers to work in community agencies and assists such agencies to develop their own volunteer programs.

WELFARE INFORMATION SERVICE: Conducts an expert service to help people get to the right agency and maintains the most comprehensive file in Los Angeles County of health and welfare facilities, agencies and services.

METROPOLITAN RECREATION AND YOUTH SERVICES — \$9,996
Works to insure adequate coverage of recreation and youth services in L.A. County; provides a channel for cooperation of public and private agencies and representatives of the community at large in planning and development of recreation and youth services.

COMMON SERVICES GIVE MORE DOLLAR MILEAGE

AGENCY AUDIT AND POSITION CLASSIFICATION BUREAU — \$21,093
Offers a central auditing service for agencies, thus lowering agency overhead. Provides common personnel services to Chest agencies when problems in this field arise.

AGENCY FEDERATION RELATIONS DEPARTMENT — \$17,184
Provides a channel for mutual cooperation of the Welfare Federation and member agencies in creating better understanding of common problems and better working relationships.

COMMUNITY CHEST SERVICE CENTERS — \$131,408
These Centers make services more readily available to people in their own neighborhoods. Each Center houses a number of agencies and branches of central organizations, making possible substantial savings in overhead expenses.
