Healing Will Be Discussed This Sunday

"Christian Science" is the subject of the Lesson-Sermon in all Churches of Christ, Scientist, on Sunday. A portion of the service is devoted to the account of the healing of "a certain man . . . which had the dropsy," as recorded in Luke's Gospel. Jesus, after silencing any challenge of his right to heal the man, "took him, and healed him, and let him go." (14:2,4)

In a companion selection from the sermon the First Reader will include these statements from "Science and

Health with Key to the Scriptures" by Mary Baker Eddy, "The Scriptures are very sacred. Our aim must be to have them understood spiritually, for only by this understanding can truth be gained. . . . It is this spiritual perception of Scripture, which lifts humanity out of disease and death and

inspired faith." "The Bible teaches transformation of the body by the renewal of Spirit." (pp. 547, 241)

Zone Change Approved

Final approval for a zone change has been granted to Thiem Industries, Inc., who has announced plans to construct a \$100,000 electronic parts firm in Torrance.

City councilmen Tuesday approved the zone change from M-1 to M-2 at 1948 W. 174th St., where the plant will be constructed.

Spokesmen for the firm agreed to install any noise-making equipment on the far west side of the proposed building and to keep sound of operations at a minimum.

The building will be architecturally designed as either tilt-up structure or brick, officials for the firm said.
