AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE, CALIFORNIA, RELATING TO THE BUILDING IN THE "WALTERS LAKE PROPERTY" AREA.  
WHEREAS, by Ordinance No. 718 of the City Council of the City of Torrance, all construction was prohibited in the area covered by said ordinance; and  
WHEREAS, it was determined to enact said ordinance as a health and safety measure because of the lack of drainage facilities on said area; and  
WHEREAS, the Superintendent of the Torrance Unified School District applied to the City Council for removal of said prohibition in order to permit the construction of an elementary school in said prohibited area; and  
WHEREAS, said Superintendent has agreed to construct a drainage basin on said school site and to grade said site in accordance with plans and specifications as approved by the City Engineer of the City of Torrance; and has further agreed to maintain the drainage capacity of said site equal to that now existing thereon; and  
WHEREAS, by reason thereof said school will not appreciably increase the risk of damage from impounding rainwater to property inside or outside said prohibited area; and  
WHEREAS, there is no other area which will adequately and efficiently serve as the location for said school; NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:  
SECTION 1.  
That the provisions of Ordinance No. 718 be hereby repealed insofar as they apply to the site and area described property.
