Drive Started to Build Osteopathic Hospital

Action to establish a citizens' advisory committee of 50 civic leaders to aid in a harbor district campaign to build a 50-bed Harbor Osteopathic Hospital featured a meeting of directors of the hospital group this week at the Fireside Cafe in San Pedro.

Mrs. Etta Rados, San Pedro civic and club leader and member of the hospital board, was named chairman of the organizing unit. She will be assisted by Mrs. Robert Patterson of Harbor City, Dr. Rachel Jenkins of Lomita, Dr. Don Cortum of Hollywood Riviera, Dr. William C. Kimpel and Dr. Frederick A. Stange of Torrance, Mrs. Jean Pizey, Harry S. Goldsmith and Dr. Phillip Margolin of San Pedro.

Seeking Volunteers

"We plan to enlist a group of volunteer workers from among civic leaders in each community of the harbor area who will assist in guiding our campaign to a successful conclusion," Mrs. Rados declared. Preliminary plans call for the advisory group to include at least 10 representatives from each of the following areas—San Pedro, Wilmington, Lomita-Harbor City, Torrance, Rolling Hills, Palos Verdes, Redondo Beach and the south bay district.

David Lawrence, administrator of the new Long Beach Osteopathic Hospital, spoke to directors of the harbor area group giving board members data on operational costs, building practices and other information relative to the successful management of a hospital.

An executive board comprised of Dr. Robert M. Patterson of Harbor City, Harry S. Goldsmith, Robert Hopper, President Wymore and Secretary Dr. Bryce Pizey was named to handle emergency details of the move to build a new Osteopathic Hospital for the harbor area.


MCMASTER PARK
