HAVE HAPPY, FIRE SAFE VACATION, CHIEF URGES

With the vacation season rapidly approaching, County Fire Chief Keith E. Klinger requested that if everyone follows a few simple rules, they can have a much happier and carefree time.

The chief said before you leave home be sure:

1. All rubbish and trash have been removed.
2. Oily rags and paint cloths have been disposed of or put in metal containers, and that dry grass and weeds have been cleared away from buildings.
3. Turn Heaters Off
4. All stoves and heaters have been properly shut off.
5. Electrical appliances, lamps, radios, and television sets have been shut off — or better yet — disconnected.

If you, as many thousands of others, are planning to spend your vacation in our valuable forest or mountain areas be sure to:

1. Be careful with any fire, observe all local fire regulations, secure fire permits when required, place hot ashes from stoves or fireplaces in metal containers. Report any fire immediately to the closest fire station or ranger station. Never assume that someone else has done so.
2. Drown your camp fires. Camp only in approved locations. Check the local regulations and secure a permit if required. Leave your campsite clean for the next camper.
3. Observe local "No Smoking" regulations. Break your matches and crush your smokes and always remember, a carelessly discarded match can be the torch that may destroy large areas of watershed. Your County Fire Department is now posting over 350 signs in closed areas. Please obey them.

In conclusion Chief Klinger said, "Have a good time on your vacation and please make it a fire safe one."
