Two cars collided at the intersection of Highway 101 and Hawthorne Ave., Saturday, sending one person to the hospital.


Injured was Simone Whitaker, 5413 Paseo de Pablo, a passenger in the car driven by Walter Scott Whitaker of the same address.

**Appointments Being Made For ECC Fall Registration**

Full-time students wishing to enroll for the first time at El Camino College may make appointments for enrollment in the counseling office of the college beginning Monday, Merl F. Sloan, director of student personnel, announced yesterday.

Dates for actual registration will be assigned when appointments are made, the college administrator said.

**Permits Needed**  
New students who wish to enroll for less than 10 units will register by permit beginning on Aug. 21. Permits will be obtainable in the registration office on July 29 and after. Counseling appointments are not necessary for new part-time students.

Returning students who qualified for priority registration by meeting spring counseling appointments will be notified of their enrollment appointments by mail. Part-time students enrolled last spring will register on Aug. 7 and 8. Those whose surnames begin with the letters M-Z will register on Aug. 7; those from A-L will enroll on the following day.

Other former students will register by permit only. 9000 Expected

"Although complicated somewhat by the fact that over 9000 students will attempt to register for classes this fall, registration has been planned so that it will be fair to all," Sloan said. The earliest possible registration will facilitate the problem of getting desired classes for students and will alleviate problems of a last-minute rush for college personnel, he advised.

**Final Plans For Ranchero Days Studied**
