... Makes "Quiche Lorraine"

Mrs. K. Figgins Contributes Tasty French Entree Recipe

Are you bored with cooking? If so today's recipe will provide that something new and different. It's a popular entree served in France and it is especially popular in Lorraine. The recipe is being contributed by Mrs. Kelvin Figgins, who is a native of Lorraine. She came as a bride to Torrance last spring and her friends and her family are enjoying a little touch of "continental cooking."

It is known as "Quiche Lorraine" consisting of "Pate Feuilletée" or "Flaky Pastry" and a filling. "Quiche Lorraine" is a specialty of the Province of Lorraine and is to be served with a dry white wine according to Mrs. Figgins. Listed below are the pastry and filling recipes.

Pate Feuilletée
2 cups flour 2/3 cup shortening
1 teaspoon salt
Mix and sift flour and salt. Cut in 2 teaspoons of the shortening with a knife. Add enough water to make a stiff dough. Roll out in a long piece on a slightly floured board and dot with bits of shortening, using 1/3 of the remaining shortening. Fold over ends to center and fold again to make 4 layers. Press ends together and roll out. Dot again with shortening, fold and roll. Repeat this process a third time. Chill thoroughly. Butter is preferred to shortening.

Filling for Crust
Cut 1/2 lb. slab bacon in 1/4 inch cubes. Prick crust with fork and fill crust with a mixture of 2 cups whipping cream, 4 beaten eggs, and 1/8 teaspoon salt. Bake in a 450 degree oven.
