

Candidates for Lomita Council Circulate Nomination Petitions

Nomination papers for all persons who intend to become candidates for city council of the proposed new City of Lomita are now available at the Lomita Chamber of Commerce, 2213 Lomita Blvd.

The petitions must be circulated and filed with the County Registrar of Voters on or before 12 o'clock noon, Sept. 5, it was announced today by Linden H. Chandler, chairman of the Chamber of Commerce Civic Committee for Incorporation.

Normally all candidates would have had to go to Los Angeles to pick up their papers and receive personal instructions for their circulation, but Chamber President Werner Benson made special arrangements with the Registrar of Voters for local distribution.

List Requirements

Each candidate will be briefed on the circulation procedure upon picking up the papers at the Chamber, but meanwhile the following general requirements should be of interest to all prospective candidates, according to Chairman Chandler:

1—There is no filing fee or other cost attached to becoming a candidate.

2—All candidates must be registered voters and have resided within the boundaries of the proposed new city one year prior to the election.

3—Each candidate must fill out a "Declaration of Candidacy" and have it sworn to by a notary before his nomination papers can be circulated.

4—Candidates may not circulate their own papers, but must appoint "Verification Deputies" to circulate "Sponsor Certificates."

5—Any registered voter living within the boundaries of the proposed new city may be a sponsor, but must sign his name as registered and give his street address and date of signing.

6—Each candidate shall be sponsored by not less than five or more than 10 registered voters.

7—Voters may not sign nomination papers for more than five different candidates.

8—Any candidate who receives or spends more than \$200 for his campaign must file a statement of "receipts and disbursements."

Incorporation Election

The councilmanic candidates will be voted on at the same time the question of "home rule" is decided at the incorporation election on Oct. 29. The five candidates receiving the highest number of votes will be elected to serve on the first city council in the event cityhood is approved. They will be non-salaried and the only elected officials of the new municipality.

Normally, city councilmen in a City of General Laws, which Lomita will become if incorporated, serve for four years and are elected on a

staggered basis every two years; but in as much as the law specifies the General Law cities shall hold their regular elections in even-numbered years, this will not apply to the first Lomita councilmen elected on Oct. 29.

The two candidates receiving the highest number of votes will serve until April, 1960; and the three receiving the next highest number of

votes will serve until April, of next year. Thereafter, all councilmen will serve for the full four-year terms, with three being elected in 1958 and two in 1960, and so on throughout the future.

The five councilmen elected on Oct. 29, will name one of their numbers as mayor, and all other officials of the city will be appointed by the council.
