A clown, monkey and dog acts, and a tree loaded with bright balloons of all sizes and colors added to the carnival spirit when the Volunteers for Children, Inc., gave their monthly party for the children patients at Harbor General Hospital. Adding to the pleasure were balloons decorated with happy faces tied to the arms of all the chairs.

Penny Parker, the clown, was dressed in a gaily striped costume with a pert little red hat perched on the top of his head. He capered around doing magic tricks and making funny faces keeping the children and special guests, patients from the orthopedic wards, in gales of laughter. His trick dogs and monkeys, in their fancy outfits, had everyone gasping in delight and clapping their hands in appreciation.

Mrs. George Morehart and Mrs. Arthur Cowie, co-chairmen of the monthly parties, did an outstanding job colorfully decorating the clown-shaped cookies. In keeping with the midway atmosphere, big ice cream bars and lemonade were served. The refreshments were planned by Miss Elizabeth Starr, head dietician.

Assisting in serving the food were Mmes. Donald Smith, John Murphy, Robert Smith, Angelo Peters, John Stoddard, Helen Galvan, and Joseph Dock. The Candystrippers,

under the direction of Mrs. Elmer G. McAllister, head of Volunteer Services, served the orthopedic patients.

The parties are given each month to celebrate the birthdays of the children during that particular month and to give the children something to divert their attention away from themselves thus aiding in their progress. The money for these parties comes from the \$1000 a year that is given to the Volunteers for Children, Inc., by the Torrance Kiwanis club, their sponsor. The money is used for other numerous projects to benefit the children. There are birthday presents, material to make robes and pajamas, presents for the good fairy to leave when a child loses his tooth, replacement of toys, etc.

The Volunteers in their pert pink pinafores are constantly looking for new ways to aid in the well being of the hospitalized children. These projects are feature movies, shown every Saturday night; the monthly parties; the toy cabinet full of toys for the children to use; and most important the Volunteers being "substitute mothers" to all children at Harbor. It is their way of carrying the Volunteers for Children's motto, "Tender, Loving Care to those children who are sick, frightened, lonely, bored, and to some who have perhaps never known the meaning of the word Love."

More women are needed in this endeavor. Although the group numbers around 100, at least 50 more are needed so that two women can be in the wards, mornings, afternoons, evenings seven days a week. Any interested women may contact Mrs. Herman Weston, 360 36th St., Manhattan Beach; Mrs. Joseph Dock or Mrs. John Stoddard, 3209 Antonio St., Torrance. The only requirements are that each serve at least 4 hours per month; buy her own uniform at a cost of about \$4.50; pay \$1 per year dues, and take the physical given free of charge by the hospital.
