



## Rivierans Turn Attention Back To Doughnut and Away from Hole

There's an old saying that goes "Keep your eyes upon the doughnut and not upon the hole."

We're happy to report that at last week's meeting the Board of Directors of the Hollywood Riviera Community Assn. shifted their eyes back to the doughnut. They "re-affirmed their stand for a hotel rather than a motel to be erected on Riviera's ocean bluff property."

Little if anything was said about their move of the previous week to have the whole thing rezoned R-1 for single family residences only. They are to be congratulated; the whole issue is now back in proper focus. Everyone is now concentrating on the doughnut instead of that "blue sky" hole. A resort hotel is what all of us would like to see erected on the ocean front. Thinking Rivierans have pointed out that not only would R-1 devalue that ocean front property but would be directly opposed to the written pledges signed by all Beach Estates residents saying they would not oppose the erection of a hotel or multiple residence.

This column suggests (as it has in the past) to give Don-Ja-Ran another chance to come up with a hotel plan that would satisfy all interests involved. Their original plans seemed to satisfy everyone; their second plans (with kitchens in each apartment) did not.

Perhaps a compromise is in order—half with kitchens and half bachelor style. The completion of a new and beautiful resort hotel—the Santa Monica Biltmore—was announced last weekend. Each unit has a color-coordinated kitchen. Is that bad? Does the edifice not enhance its community? Does it devalue surrounding properties? We think not.
