The request was made to protect children who have to cross the street to get to the nearby 232nd Pl. School. At the present time, the speed limit along Figueroa is 50 miles per hour.


Whooping Cough Tops Local Disease List

Six cases of whooping cough were reported in the area, two of them in the city of Torrance. In second place was epilepsy which claimed three victims, one in Torrance. One case each of measles, mumps, and tuberculosis also was reported.


