

## Billy Graham Film Slated by Baptists

The story of Scotland's long struggle against tyranny will be told in a movie, "Fire on the Heather," to be shown at the Crenshaw Baptist Church, 18749 Crenshaw Blvd., next Wednesday at 7:30 p.m.

The film, produced by the Billy Graham organization, features dramatic scenes from Scotch history—from the time of the Romans, through the introduction of Christianity and of John Knox, down to the present day. Performers are an all Scottish cast, led by actor Duncan McCraw. Donald Crisp is narrator.

It also features many scenes from present-day Scotland and shots of the Billy Graham Crusade in Glasgow.

## Rev. Christ Presbytery's New Leader

Presbyterians of Southern California have named the Rev. Karl James Christ, pastor of First Presbyterian Church, to serve as their moderator for the winter session of Los Angeles Presbytery.

Rev. Mr. Christ, who has served the Tustin congregation for the past 12 years, was unanimously elected at the final meeting of the summer session held last week at Presbyterian Conference Grounds, Pacific Palisades. He succeeds Dr. W. Clarence Wright, pastor of Wilshire Church, Los Angeles. The moderator-elect is active in affairs of the church beyond his local parish. He is currently serving as chairman of Los Angeles Presbytery's Committee on Credentials, and also serves Synod of California as chairman of its Committee on Foreign Missions. He was a commissioner to the denomination's General Assembly last year in Philadelphia.

Induction service for the new moderator will be held at the opening meeting of the winter session, scheduled for Nov. 12 in Calvary Church, Hawthorne.

Delegates to the presbytery meeting, representing 173 individual congregations in Los Angeles, Orange and San Diego Counties, approved almost unanimously a resolution which recommended "active participation in the affairs of local school boards, including policy formation and elections," and urged the churches to "actively support the initiative measure which would return parochial schools to the tax list."

## Great Books Group Sets First Meet

The first meeting of a new Great Books Discussion Group will be held at the Redondo Beach Senior Citizens Building, in City Park adjacent to the Elks Club on Catalina Ave., on Wednesday, Sept. 25, from 8 to 10 p.m.

The group will meet once every other week for two hours to discuss the works of the greatest philosophers and poets—works as ancient as Plato and the Bible, as modern as Freud and Einstein. The selection to be discussed at the first meeting is the Declaration of Independence. Copies will be furnished at the meeting.
