CITIZENS COMMITTEE TO RAISE FUNDS FOR BAND

A total of \$2300 in cash and pledges has been received by the citizens committee raising funds to send the Torrance Area Youth Band to Chicago for the Mid-West National Band Clinic in December.

The committee headed by Mrs. Clara Conner, Torrance postmaster, hopes to raise half of the \$25,000 needed to send the 82 musicians, chaperones and staff members to the clinic.

Youth Band members and their parents are raising the rest of the money.

Cost of sending one student is \$250 and 50 "sponsors" are being sought by the citizens group.
