the Torrance department since 1946. A native of Oakland, he has lived in Torrance since 1940.

Up Through Ranks Porter started on the force as a patrolman, and moved up through the ranks of sergeant and lieutenant before his appointment yesterday to the second post in the department.

Porter served more than seven years in the Navy during World War II, and was a skipper of a tug in the South Pacific during that campaign. He is active in the Church of Jesus Christ of the Latter Day Saints, and holds important offices in the church.

Bennett said yesterday that there would be "some reorganization" in the future. He expects to appoint five new patrolmen as soon as the eligible list is announced, and currently has five new officers attending the Sheriff's training center in Los Angeles.

Promotions Planned

The promotions create vacancies in the department which will be filled by examination, Bennett said. He said he probably would get two captains, and one lieutenant and sergeant. Other promotions will be made to fill vacancies by these boosts in rank, Bennett said.

Bennett emphasized that his appointment of Porter for the No. 2 job followed city council policy in naming the top man on the eligible list.

The council earlier this year criticized some departments for "jumping" men over others in the appointments, although, under civil service rules, the appointing officer has a choice of the top three on the eligible list.

(Continued from Page 1) the new City Hall, 3031 Torrance Blvd.

3. A bank building adjoining the present South Bay Municipal Court in Redondo Beach.

The Torrance City Council has offered \$4000 to help fix up the old City Hall, which is presently unused, but which housed a municipal court for 20 years until the South Bay Municipal Court was established four years ago.

Various Statements

Various conflicting statements have been made by various county officials as to the status of the location of a court branch here. They included:

1. The court definitely would be located in the old City Hall.

2. The City Hall site would cost \$12,000 to refurbish, and the bank building adjoining the present court would cost only \$1500.

3. The council chambers of the new City Hall would be better than either of the other sites.

Temporary Quarters

The temporary court facilities—wherever they would be located—would serve until the County builds a permanent court building on the Torrance Civic Center on land donated by the city. The project is due to go to bid early next year and will take about nine months to complete.

A third judge for the South Bay Municipal Court—Judge Donald Armstrong—was recently appointed to take care of the increased case load in the area which includes Torrance, cities and county areas south of Rosecrans and west of the Los Angeles city limits.


