## All Can Have Healthier, Happier Living, Speaker Declares Here

Healthier, happier, more abundant living is available to all today in the degree these goals are sought in the spiritual understanding of God, man, and the universe, Harry B. MacRae of Dallas, Tex., said in a Christian Science lecture here last Thursday.

Something more than a religious philosophy is needed to heal the sick, redeem the sinner, and solve the problems of daily living, MacRae maintained.

Stressing the universal nature of practical Christianity, he told his audience that the priceless blessings which result from effective prayer are "yours to accept today."

**Local Church Services**  
On nationwide tour "as a member of the Christian Science Board of Lectureship, MacRae spoke under the auspices of First Church of Christ Scientist, Torrance in the church edifice, 218th and Manuel. Mrs. Ruth Brossart, second reader, introduced him.

Speaking on the subject, Christian Science: Its Correct View of God and Man Brings Healing," MacRae declared that true healing, as taught by Christ Jesus, "rests upon the spiritual understanding of God, as Father-Mother, as All-in-All, and of man as His perfect expression."

According to the lecturer such understanding is not an unattainable and impractical ideal, but a demonstrable fact. Applicable to problems of every kind, this healing understanding is enabling men and women everywhere, he said, to overcome fear, discouragement, and despair, and to gain the "confidence, right expectancy, and moral courage that make for a joyous, harmonious, abundant life."

**Clear View Needed**  
Explaining the basis for quick and permanent healing, he said that when "we gain a clear view of man as His idea, we are instantly able to demonstrate the healing efficacy of divine power." When man comes to know what Christ is and that the same Christ, Truth, that Jesus proved in His healings is forever our Christ here and now, he said, the lecturer said, that he is able to heal, according to the degree of his understanding, as the Master did.

In this connection MacRae recalled the experience of Mrs. Eddy. In reading in the Bible about Jesus' healing of the

palsied man, she gained a clearer view of God's allness and ever-presence, and she was healed of the effects of what at first appeared to be a fatal accident.

In discussing how true prayer heals, the lecturer pointed out that demonstration more than definition explains prayer in Christian Science. "No mere words," he declared, "can make prayer fully comprehensible. But demonstrating its power in healing the sick and reforming the sinner removes all doubt as to what prayer is and what it does."

**Mental Activity**  
Whether audible or inaudible, true prayer is a spiritually mental activity, he affirmed: "It is spiritual understanding that constantly and consciously maintains our awareness of the ever-presence and all-power of God."

The effect of such prayer is seen, he said, in its supplying of everyday needs including the healing of sickness, the purification of character, the enhancement of abilities, and the provision for abundant living.

In the practice of Christian Science, prayer and treatment are synonymous, he said. Treatment, he explained, is "the understanding prayer that affirms God's allness and goodness, the perfection of His idea, man; denies the reality of all error; and, thus, heals the sick and meets every human need."

**Hearing Aided**  
MacRae told how a friend of his found scientific prayer an effective means of availing himself of God's power when faced by almost complete loss of hearing. He had turned to surgery, but with discouraging results. The doctors informed him that nothing could be done for him because essential parts of the ear were beyond recovery.

"In his despair, and as a last resort," Mr. MacRae said, "he looked to Christian Science, and asked an authorized Christian Science practitioner for treatment." After describing the treatment, the lecturer reported that the hearing was brought about and his hearing was restored.

The correct view of God and man which heals its attainable by all, he emphasized. The ability to understand the Christ, Truth and to gain radiant health and more abundant living is God-bestowed.


bian Horse Show at Kellogg's Ranch.

**Served in Navy**

## Lay-Offs Affect 700 Workers at Douglas Plant

Some 700 office and clerical employees of the El Segundo and Torrance facilities of Douglas Aircraft Co. were laid off last week.

Reason for the cutback in number of employees given by plant officials was the slow decline of factory work forces in recent weeks.

Dismissal of the group was anticipated in previous company statements forecasting gradual reduction of personnel at California plants to a 70,000 total by Jan. 1, according to Harold G. Hynd, vice president and general manager.

Hynd also announced there might be additional cutbacks in personnel later on.
