City Observes Moose-Sponsored 'Youth Honor Day' Here Today

Local Woman Awaits Fate Of Relative

A Torrance woman yesterday was awaiting word from Tijuana, Mex. concerning the fate of her brother-in-law who is being held in custody because he had a traffic accident. The arrested man, Donald J. O'Hara of Los Angeles, is the brother-in-law of Mrs. Benjamin Di Fiore, 16932 Edgar Ave. O'Hara was arrested last Monday after an auto he was driving left the Tijuana-Ensenada Highway near Rosarito Beach and crashed. State highway police booked him on a charge of speeding and bail was set at \$400. He also was charged with a federal offense of damaging a government highway, with bail of an additional \$400 set pending a hearing in Federal Court. Mrs. Di Fiore said she had sent \$500 for bail and was told later another \$500 would be necessary. O'Hara had a fractured jaw and possible rib fractures, Mexican officials released the L. A. man's father and brother who continued on to the United States for medical treatment.

Employment Wage Data Filing Deadline Today

Today is the deadline for filing California Unemployment Insurance wage reports and contribution returns for the third quarter of 1957. T. D. Weld, auditor in charge of the State Department of Employment in Long Beach has reminded employers. Penalty and interest will be charged if the report is filed after the deadline, Weld said. Employers needing assistance in preparing their returns may contact the audit section at 1315 Pine Ave., Long Beach.

LAW IN ACTION

Tax Arbitrations

Because the laws of the 48 states often differ, lawyers try, when they can, to avoid lawsuits involving parties in two or more states. Federal instead of state courts most often have to try such cases. And, involving hearings and witnesses from afar, they are often more difficult than their state cases. So lawyers urge people with property in two or more states to have wills clearly written to avoid such cases. But sometimes they arise, even with carefully drawn wills, and California has worked out a way to cut down on needless lawsuits. Suppose two states lay claim to the death tax on John Doe's estate? Which one gets it? Well, the states could go to court and have it out. And perhaps the estate would pay two sets of taxes. But a cheaper way lies in arbitration, and the California legislature set up an even easier way this year to decide a decedent's domicile for such tax purposes. Formerly only our Controller, but today an executor or any of the other taxing officials may also choose to arbitrate. All he has to do is notify all the tax officials, executors, and "interested parties" (which includes heirs). If this is agreeable, the arbitration goes on: The parties pick the arbitrators. Where there are only two states their tax officials each name an arbitrator who in turn name the third one. Where three or more states are involved, the officials name tax authorities from three other states, and they each in turn name a member for the arbitration board. The board has subpoena power and hears all parties concerned. The board's decision is final. The case can be shortened even more sometimes: Instead of hearings, executors and taxing officials may make binding agreements as to the tax share due to each state. Note: California lawyers offer this column so you may know about our laws.
