'Mortals and Immortals' Named Topic

The words of the Golden Text from the dauntless Christian hero, Paul, set the tone for the Lesson-Sermon "Mortals and Immortals," which will be read in the Churches of Christ; Scientist, on Sunday. Paul declares, "If any man be ϵ Christ, he is a new creature; old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new." (II Cor. 5:17.) Paul's words from the same chapter of II Corinthians appear later in the sermon when he says, "For we know that if our earthly house of this tabernacle were dissolved, we have a building of God, a house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens. . . Now he that hath wrought for us the selfsame thing is God, who also hath given unto us the earnest of the Spirit" (6:1, 5). In a passage which follows Mary Baker Eddy says in "Science and Health With Key to the Scriptures," "Through many generations human beliefs will be attaining diviner conceptions, and the immortal and perfect model of God's creation will finally be seen as the only true conception of being" (p. 260).
