

The use of envelopes for mailing purposes dates back about 100 years.





The Polynesian Holds Opening

The exotic Polynesian restaurant at 3901 Pacific Coast Hwy. in WALTERIA, celebrated its grand opening last night following a week of pre-opening parties and celebrations.

Local Church's Services Set at 10:30 Thursday

Thanksgiving, the American day of rejoicing and gratitude, is a special day of religious observance and worship by the Christian Scientists. A Lesson-Sermon is especially prepared for the occasion.

The day is observed in all the Christian Science churches on Thanksgiving Day in the United States and as a special service on the same day or on an appropriate holiday in other parts of the world. The subject of the Lesson-Sermon is "Thanksgiving." The Golden Text from Psalms (50:14) exhorts, "Offer unto God thanksgiving; and say thy vows unto the most High."

In a section of the sermon the "Golden Rule" of admonition to all his followers is given in Jesus' words as recorded by Matthew, "Therefore all things whatsoever we would that men should do to you, do ye even so to them (7-12).

From "Science and Health With Key to the Scriptures" by Mary Baker Eddy this passage will be read, "God gives the lesser idea of Himself for a link to the greater, and in return, the higher always protects the lower.

On hand to greet guests were operators of the city's newest dining spot, Pete Reitz, Dick Meyers, and Paul Payne.

A native orchestra, native waiters, entertainers, and some of the South Seas' most beautiful dancers were on hand to assist with the opening — and will be regular features of the new dining spot.

At a pre-opening party Thursday night, city officials, and other invited guests sampled the offerings of the "grog list," which offers one of the widest selection of rum drinks on the mainland, and chose a dinner course from a six-page menu which lists all the native dishes of Polynesia.

The restaurant will be open at 5 p.m. daily and will have music nightly except Monday. The grand opening celebration will continue tonight.


