

## Hope EUB Drive for Funds Hits \$15,240 in First Campaign Week

A total of \$15,240 has been pledged so far to the Hope EUB Church, 3343 W. 174th St., expansion program. That's what James Brown, team captain, told a dinner meeting of the Hope congregation Wednesday, at the Western Cafe, Gardena.

A special dinner marked the launching of the church's three week drive for \$48,000 according to general chairman Paul Duckworth. More than 120 members and friends were present for the occasion.

During the next 10 days, each member of the church and friends will be contacted, said Initial Gift chairman Maurice Crone. "We are asking for a pledge, or intention to give, not actual cash contributions," said Crone.

Members will be asked to indicate what they plan to give over a 150-week, or three-year period. The pledge program is entirely voluntary, and entirely free from high pressure tactics, Crone explained.

In addition, no member will solicit another until he has first pledged to the program. "Our goal is for every member to participate in this plan for church expansion," states general chairman Duckworth. "In doing this, we are following the biblical rule that where one's treasure is there will his heart be also."

## Recruiter Describes Promotions

Of interest to high school graduates should be the fast enlisted advancement and the possibility of promotion to warrant or commissioning as Regular Navy officers through the Navy's Enlisted Advanced School Program, according to F. D. Fields, CSI Navy Recruiter.

Although this program is designed for qualifying male petty officers third class or above, with at least three years of service, the Recruiter pointed out that the recruit of today should be able to reach the petty officer third rating within his first two years of service.

Selected men are ordered to the Naval Preparatory School at Bainbridge, Md., or San Diego before entering either Purdue University or the University of Washington for their first two years of school.

Applicants are promoted automatically from third class to second class petty officer upon being accepted for the program. After completing the first year successfully, Navy students are then promoted to first class petty officer. After two years, promotion to Chief petty officer is automatic. Regardless of pay grade, men are eligible for selection to warrant officer after the first semester.

"This is an excellent opportunity for fast promotion for young men entering the Navy with a career in mind," said Fields.
