He entered the Army in November 1956, received basic training at Fort Ord, Calif., and arrived in the Far East last April.

The graduation exercises, marking the end of nine weeks of "boot camp," included a full dress parade and review before military officials and civilian dignitaries.

In nine weeks of instruction, the "raw recruit" is developed into a Navy Bluejacket, ready for duty with the fleet.

The course included the latest infantry tactics, first aid, demolitions, field fortifications and advanced schooling on weapons.

Trainees learn that all Marines are basically infantrymen, whether they serve as cooks, typists, truck drivers, or with aviation units.

The vertical envelopment operation was the first long-range airlift of Marines by helicopter. Previously helicopters had been used up to distances of 30 miles; here they lifted troops 130 miles inland to an abandoned air base near Holtville in California's Imperial Valley.

The exercise began when the troops, reinforced with tanks, amphibious tractors, artillery, reconnaissance men and naval gunfire teams, made an amphibious landing on Camp Pendleton's beaches.

Following the initial envelopment and capture of the air strip by helicopter troops, an additional 450 Leathernecks were flown in by Marine R5D transport aircraft.
