Lomita Baptists Slate Revival Sept. 29-Oct. 13

The First Baptist Church of Lomita will hold a series of special Evangelistic Services Sept. 29-Oct. 13, according to the pastor, Rev. J. W. Hardin. Rev. Charles Ashcraft of Las Vegas, Nev., will be the evangelist and W. A. Risinger, educational director at Yuma, Ariz., will lead the singing. Rev. Ashcraft was born in Arkansas and is a graduate of Malvern High School, Quichita Baptist College of Arkadelphia, Ark., and the Southern Baptist Seminary, Louisville, Kentucky. During World War II he served as Chaplain in the Southwest Pacific. After the war he returned to Louisville for graduate study and served as Brotherhood secretary of the Baptist General Convention of New Mexico for five years. While serving as Brotherhood Secretary he visited the gambling capitol of Las Vegas and decided the city needed a Baptist Church. He resigned this post to pioneer the establishment of a new church in Las Vegas. Risinger is a prominent Baptist layman who has served as brotherhood president of Arizona, trustee of Grand Canyon College, and a member of the executive board. He has built a great choir at the First Southern Baptist Church of Yuma. The services will be at 10:30 a.m. and 7:30 p.m.
