Seaside Church Dedicates Education-Fellowship Wing

Dedication of the new educational-fellowship unit of the Seaside Community (Evangelical and Reformed) United Church of Christ located at Ocean Ave. and 230th St. will be held at 3 p.m. Sunday.

Speaker for the dedication will be Dr. John Flucke, pastor of Morningside Community E&R Church, Inglewood. Also participating in the ceremonies will be Waugh Smith, architect; Harry Schneider, contractor; Roger Schriefer, building committee chairman; and Roy Burt, consistory president. Other guests will include Dr. Jeffrey Perrin, superintendent of the Congregational Christian Conference of the Southwest Area, and Rev.

Hugh Percy, president of the Torrance Ministerial Assn.

Slides depicting the progress of the building under construction will be shown by the Senior Youth Fellowship.

Immediately following the service, a reception will be held by the Women's Guild.

CONSTRUCTED on a 2½-acre site purchased in January, 1955, the building was designed by the architectural firm of Killingsworth, Brady & Smith of Long Beach. It is 120 feet long by 21 feet wide, and cost approximately \$29,000.

Sliding panels divide the building into separate classrooms for the nursery, kindergarten, primary, junior and senior groups. When these rooms are opened, the classrooms become a large room for fellowship meetings. Sliding glass doors form the north wall of each room.

Adjoining the classrooms is the kitchen featuring sliding cupboard doors, two sinks, garbage disposal, and a pass-through for serving. Adjacent to the nursery is a crib room with built-in beds. A ladies' lounge, men's restroom, and a storeroom complete the unit. Running the full length of the south side of the building is a cloister which joins the new unit to the existing chapel.

A narthex featuring a wall constructed of Belgian stained glass and vertical redwood paneling was added to the chapel. Alterations to the existing chapel included the con-
