Employers Must File Tax Forms By February 16

State Controller Alan Cranston, chairman of the Franchise Tax Board, stated this week that the due date for filing Forms 599 and 596, information returns, is Monday, Feb. 16.

All individuals, partnerships, and corporations engaged in a trade or business in California who make payments of salaries, interest, dividends, rents, and other types of income must file these reports, Cranston said.

Employers must file an information return, Form 599, for each single employee who earned \$2000 or more and each married employee who earned \$3500 or more during 1958, the controller explained.

"Payments of dividends during 1958 to any one individual must be reported if the total amount was \$100 or more. Form 599 must be filed reporting payments of interest, royalties, and other fixed or determinable income for each person paid \$200 or more," he added.

State information returns, Forms 599 and 596, may be obtained from the office of the Franchise Tax Board at 1025 P Street, Sacramento 14.

Dump Seen As Future Park Site

Citing use as a future park site as the silver lining in the cloud of unsightly rubble marred the land-fill operations at the county's Palos Verdes dump in Torrance, County Engineer John A. Lambie explained away fears of the county park and recreation commissioner at a meeting of the Board of Supervisors Tuesday.

Admitting that broken-down stoves and refrigerators, old automobile tires, waste lumber, tree shrubs, and broken concrete are not a pleasant sight, Lambie pointed out that means have been developed by engineers which can compact the rubbish into future usable ground.

"During the past 10 years, many such operations have reclaimed marginal land for agricultural use and for park and recreational purposes in and adjacent to the Los Angeles metropolitan area," Lambie stated.
