Stockton Gets Babe Ruth Loop World Series

A year after the arrival of major league basketball on the west coast, California will mark another sports "first" August 24-29, when the eighth annual Babe Ruth League World Series will be held at Stockton's Billy Hebert field. Award of the 1959 series to Stockton was announced today by the Babe Ruth League Board of Directors, after it studied proposals from half a dozen cities.

Eight regional champions representing the cream of more than 100,000 boys in the world's largest baseball program for 13-15-year-olds will seek the 1959 crown in the annual round of baseball excitement and sightseeing tours. With more than 1,200 leagues last year in its seventh season of operation, the Babe Ruth League program crowned champions in each of the United States, Hawaii, seven Canadian provinces and several European countries. California accounted for 114 of those circuits.

Played on standard-sized diamonds and under professional baseball rules, Babe Ruth League baseball represents a major step-up from Little League play. Its World Series contestants invariably display high degrees of skill, with major league scouts flocking to the Series to get a look at future greats.

Previous series have been held in Trenton, N. J., 1952 and 1953; Washington, D. C., 1954; Austin, Tex., 1955; Portland, Ore., 1956; Ann Arbor, Mich., 1957, and Vancouver, B. C., 1958.

The board of directors of the 36-team Stockton Babe Ruth League, headed by Chief of Police Jack O'Keefe, will serve as the world series committee.
