The association banner for attaining the highest number of attendance points was awarded to El Nido Church.



'Reality' Is Easter Topic

"Reality" will be the subject of the lesson-sermon for all Christian Science churches on Easter Sunday. The sermon will open with the Golden Text from Mark, "Jesus came from Galilee, preaching the gospel of the kingdom of God, and saying, The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand" (1:14, 15).

Jesus' words from John's Gospel, assuring redemption to all, are included in the lesson-sermon, "God sent not his Son into the world to condemn the world; but that the world through him might be saved . . . And this is the condemnation, that light is come into the world, and men loved darkness rather than light, because their deeds were evil . . . But he that doeth truth cometh to the light, that his deeds may be made manifest, that they are wrought in God" (3:17, 19, 21).
