

Chapel Discusses Some Pending Bills and Those Already Signed

Governor Brown has signed into law three of my bills. One is of particular interest to Avalon and all of Santa Catalina Island and of general interest to all fishermen. It is my Assembly Bill No. 721, relating to gill nets used to catch flying fish for bait.

At first thought this seems to be a rather cruel and unusual bill, but the catching of flying fish for bait has been on the statute books for many years, long before I was first elected in 1950. My law changes the area where flying fish can be caught legally from where it has been, in the vicinity of the City of Avalon, and moves the zone to the northerly side of Santa Catalina Island between Long Point and

the extreme westerly end of the island.

This satisfies the people of Avalon, who like to have flying fish as a tourist attraction, the sporting fishermen who share with the inhabitants of the Island the pleasure of watching flying fish in action, and the commercial fishermen who have been catching flying fish for bait for generations. Apparently everyone is happy about the new law, which is remarkable because usually sporting fishermen and commercial fishermen fight one another bitterly.

MY ASSEMBLY Bill No. 360, also signed into law by Governor Brown, provides that any person entitled to participate in promotional examinations for positions in a county

classified civil service shall be entitled to participate in promotional examinations for positions in the classified civil service of an air pollution district established and functioning in the county, and to be appointed to such district position. In plain English, this law broadens the opportunity for advancement in Los Angeles County civil service.

A somewhat similar bill was my Assembly Bill No. 361, also pertaining to county civil service promotional examinations, except that this opened up jobs in the Los Angeles Flood Control District Civil Service System so that such jobs are no longer in a separate and distinct promotional list, but open to all Los Angeles County civil service employees. This

bill also was signed into law by Governor Brown.


ASSEMBLY Bill No. 1974, by the Honorable Charles Meyers, Democrat, of San Francisco, is a bill pertaining to water pollution of vital importance to everyone interested in our beaches, particularly the citizens of Playa del Rey, El Segundo, Manhattan Beach, Hermosa Beach, Redondo Beach, the Hollywood Riviera section of the City of Torrance, Palos Verdes Estates, Rolling Portuguese Bend, Catalina Island, Inglewood and Westchester (Los Angeles 45), because they have had good cause in the past to complain bitterly about all beach pollution, especially at Manhattan Beach and Hermosa Beach.

THE MEYERS Bill (A.B. 1974), takes up where two laws of which I was the author in 1957 started the trend toward restoring the beaches to our citizens. One of the interesting features which will appeal to both sporting and commercial fishermen is a provision which provides enforcement of certain prohibitions relative to water pollution by the Department of Fish and Game, if the regional water pollution control boards have not established appropriate requirements. This follows the policy of one of the laws I wrote which took a large part of the authority away from the state and regional water pollution control boards (which did nothing except protect those polluting our beaches) and gave it back to the State Department of Public Health.


