

Artists Form Local Co-op

Preliminary groundwork to the opening of a cooperative gallery where local artists can permanently exhibit their works is being laid here this week, according to Vicki Feldon, president of Artists' Sales Gallery Cooperative, which has filed papers to be recognized by the state as a non-profit

making organization. According to Mrs. Feldon, the day of the wealthy collector of art is gone. The average purchaser of art, she stated, is the young professional and semi-professional middle-income group, who are buying art not as an investment but because they like the art works.

PURPOSE of the cooperative gallery, she stated, is to do away with the middleman. She said her group plans to always have one artist on hand to sell directly to the public.

Biggest challenge to the group at present, she stated, is to find a permanent site where the 30 members of the co-op can exhibit their paintings, sculpture, prints, crafts, and jewelry. Plans call for gallery space large enough for 50 paintings, a browsing area, and sufficient parking facilities.

NEW DEL AMO PROJECT . . . A satellite building to cost \$1½ million will be erected east of the Broadway Department Store on the Del Amo Shopping Center to house a Food Giant Markets store and a Thrifty Drug Store. Foundation permits for the new building were issued this week, and construction of the project is expected to be completed before Aug. 31.

Plans for New Thrifty Drug, Food Giant On Del Amo Told

Coldwell, Banker & Co. leasing agents for the Del Amo Shopping Center in Torrance, have disclosed lease negotiations with Thrifty Drug Co. and Food Giant Markets have been finalized.

An 80,000-square-foot building will be constructed 500 feet east of the recently completed Broadway Department Store.

THRIFTY and Food Giant will occupy the major portion of the \$1½ million satellite building with exception of 4000 square feet of space at the south end.

Food Giant Markets' total requirements will be 56,000 square feet, allowing merchandising areas in excess of 30,000 square feet, largest in the chain.

Ted Cummings, president of Food Giant Markets, said aside from the most modern display techniques being planned, a complete meat-cutting and packaging department will be featured which allows public viewing of the entire process through glass enclosures, recent innovation.

THRIFTY DRUG Co. will occupy the north 20,000 square feet of the building. Display

windows facing north on Carson St., as well as to the west, will provide Thrifty with natural light.

A special lunch-counter arrangement will be incorporated along with the customary diversified merchandising lines carried by Thrifty's 143-store chain.

DESIGNED BY Welton Becket & Associates A.I.A., the westward facing frontage of the building will be fully glassed, off-set by multi-colored plastic panels at the base of the structure.

The Del Amo Estate Co., owners of the proposed building, have appointed the Olman Construction Co., Monterey Park, as builders and contractors.

Peter DeFrancisci, planning co-ordinator for Del Amo, expects Thrifty and Food Giant to take occupancy of their new satellite building by Aug. 31.

Old Fire Engine To Give Rides

"Ole Maud," a 1917 Seagraves fire engine which was delivered to the city of Oxnard in that year, will be at the Foods Co. store at Pacific Coast Hwy. and Crenshaw from 10 a.m. until 4 p.m. Saturday, market officials revealed.
