'Nut Roll' Tasty Delicacy For This Holiday Season

Another recipe appropriate for the holiday season is the "Nut Roll" contributed today by Mrs. Arthur Moss, 17508 Ermanita. Mrs. Moss and her husband moved to Torrance eight years ago. They are active in the North Torrance Civic Improvement Assn. and she is a former member of the Torrance Woman's Club.

The couple are the parents of one son, Marvin A. Moss, of Sherman Oaks. Mrs. Moss has won quite a reputation with her neighbors as an excellent cook. Her other hobbies are gardening, decorating and oil painting.

For Torrance HERALD readers, she today gives her favorite recipe.

NUT ROLL

1/2 lb. butter 2 tsp. sugar
4 cups flour 4 egg yolks
2 yeast cakes 1 cup lukewarm water

Dissolve yeast in warm milk. Work butter, flour, sugar, egg yolks together. Divide dough in four parts and let stand for two hours.

NUT ROLL FILLING

2 cups water Vanilla
2 cups sugar Lemon juice
1 lb. ground walnuts Lemon rind

Roll out dough, cover with nut mixture. Make four rolls. Brush rolls with egg white. Bake for 50 to 55 minutes in moderate oven.

Mrs. Moss says that poppy seeds may be used in the filling instead of nuts. The four rolls make about 100 slices. They will keep indefinitely in the refrigerator.
