**ORDINANCE NO. 925**  
**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE ADDING SECTIONS TO CHAPTER 1 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE, 1954, PROVIDING FOR THE PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS OF THE PROVISIONS OF SAID CODE.**  
The City of Torrance does ordain as follows:  
**SECTION 1.** The following sections are hereby added to Chapter 1 of "The Code of the City of Torrance, 1954" to read in their entirety as follows:  
"Section 1.20. Issuance of citations for violations of this ordinance and other city ordinances.  
When any person is arrested for a violation of this Code or of any uncodified ordinance of the city and such person is not indicted as provided in section 1.21 of the Code of the City of Torrance, 1954, the arresting officer shall prepare in duplicate a written citation to appear in court, containing the name and address of such person, the offense charged and the time and place where and when such person shall appear in court.  
Section 1.21. A person who is arrested for a violation of this Code or of any uncodified ordinance of the city and such person is not indicted as provided in section 1.21 of the Code of the City of Torrance, 1954, shall be held in custody until such person appears in court. If such person fails to appear in court as required by this section, the officer shall issue a warrant for the arrest of such person. If such person appears in court and fails to do so on or before the date which he promises to appear, then, within twenty days after the delivery of such written promise to appear by the officer to a magistrate having jurisdiction over the offense."  
**SECTION 2.**  
Any provision of the Torrance City Code, or appendices thereto, inconsistent herewith, to the extent of such inconsistency and no further, are hereby repealed.  
**SECTION 3.**  
This ordinance shall take effect thirty days after the date of its adoption and prior to the expiration of fifteen days from the passage thereof shall be published at least once in the Torrance Herald, a semi-weekly newspaper of general circulation, published and circulated in the City of Torrance.
