AREA PUBLISHERS RENOMINATED AS CNPA DIRECTORS

Herman H. Ridder of Long Beach and King Williams of Torrance have been renominate to serve as members of the Board of Directors of the California Newspaper Publishers Assn. Election will take place at the annual meeting of the association to be held Feb. 6-9 at the Coronado Hotel in San Diego.

Ridder is publisher of the Long Beach Press-Telegram and Independent and Williams is publisher of the HERALD. Bert J. Abraham of the Bellflower Herald-Enterprise has been nominated for president, succeeding Eugene C. Bishop of Palo Alto.

RYAN GETS BIG NAVY CONTRACT

The Navy awarded a new \$6 1/4 million contract for advanced model KDA-4 Firebee jet drone missiles to the Ryan Aeronautical Corp., President T. Clyde Ryan announced last week.

Fabrication of Firebee parts is done at Ryan's main plant in San Diego, with final assembly at the company's new factory in Torrance.

Additional funds allocated by the Navy for KDA-4 spare parts are expected to boost the total value of the contract to over \$8 million.

Extends Production
The new contract will extend Firebee production well into the latter part of 1959 and will be phased in with Ryan's present volume production of KDA-1 Firebee target drones for the Navy and Q-2A models for the Air Force.

At an increasing number of military bases, Firebees are regularly flying high-speed, high-altitude missions of an hour or more duration. These swept-wing pilotless jet target planes are capable of 600 mph speeds and altitudes up to 50,000 feet. Air-launched, and recoverable by parachute, they are used for training crews operating the air-to-air and ground-to-air missiles of the nation's air defense system.

Ryan Firebees are also widely used in connection with the development of new weapon systems; in their testing and evaluation phases, plus the crew training and proficiency phases, because of their realistic simulation of "enemy" targets. They have the maneuverability and high performance of modern jet aircraft and the endurance "on station" over the gunnery range which permits a firing exercise to be completed.

Development of even more advanced versions of the Firebee for both the Air Force and Navy, and of specialized auxiliary equipment, is proceeding along with present production on current models. Ryan engineers are working on new "missile compatibility" programs to broaden the Firebee's usefulness with missile systems and to extend its capabilities to keep pace with the stepped up performance of new weapons.
