

Elks Lodge Hosts Chamber Officials at Dinner Meet

What Torrance Lodge No. 1948 is doing to take its part in the Torrance community was reviewed Wednesday night when directors of the Chamber of Commerce were specially honored guest at a gala dinner meeting in the hall above 1951 Carson St.

The meeting was presided over by Ralph Jakubowski, exalted ruler. Short addresses were made by visiting and local Elks officials and Chamber representatives including President O. R. Trueblood and Former President A. E. "Tommy" Thompson.

Today, it was pointed out by speakers Wednesday night, marks the 90th anniversary of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks. Coincidentally, it is also the third anniversary of the Torrance lodge which will observe the event Wednesday. In that time the local lodge has enrolled an active membership of several hundred and is presently planning to initiate its largest class.

The lodge also has acquired

a ground site for its new home and looks forward to a flourishing growth in the next year.

Lodge spokesmen cited numerous accomplishments of the Torrance lodge during its short but active history. A broad youth program, always a national policy of the Elks, has been instituted including the sponsorship of three Boy Scout troops, a Little League baseball team and rifle classes under the direction of NRA instructors.

Plans are under way for the organization of a Tee-Timers automobile club. During the years the local club has awarded an annual scholarship to a deserving boy or girl in one of the high schools and a committee under the direction of Paul Warren is planning to extend the award to other schools in Torrance. The club also has been active on an anti-narcotics education program aimed at discouraging juvenile delinquency.

Chief Lauds Fast Action Of Officers

Fast, efficient work of the Torrance Police Department in handling Sunday's fatal airplane crash was cited yesterday by Chief Percy Bennet and Assistant Chief M. H. Porter.

Receiving word of the accident at 7:57 a.m., ambulances were on the scene and moving the lone survivor to Harbor General Hospital by 8:10 a.m. By 9:15 the three fatalities were at the mortuary and one hour later the dead body reports had been completed. Lt. Ted Morris also had completed identification of the victims by matching fingerprints by this time.

Less than five hours after the crash, wreckage had been removed from the scene.

The fast work of the local officers was done in a maze of fog which kept visibility at a minimum.

Y REVEALS ADVENTURE CLUB PLANS

The schedule for the next YMCA Adventure Club program was revealed by Joe Wilcox, executive secretary for the Torrance YMCA.

The YMCA Adventure Club is a Saturday activity program for boys eight through 12 years of age. The next session begins on Saturday and continues for five weeks.

Wilcox pointed out that the local YMCA program is open to all boys in the area within the proper age range. He outlined the schedule as follows: Feb. 22—Cinerama's "Seven Wonders of the World" will be visited by the boys in the morning, with hikes in Griffith Park during the afternoon.

March 1—Hiking and exploring in historic Echo Mountain area, with climb up the old incline railway.

March 8—The boys will enjoy a boat tour of the Los Angeles Harbor in the morning, and then visit Cabrillo Beach Marine Museum and Lighthouse in the afternoon.

March 15—Roller Skating Ring for fun and lessons in the morning and the annual YMCA kite flying contest in the afternoon.

March 22—The final day will feature the annual YMCA track meet in the morning, and will conclude with a huge campfire program that evening at the YMCA.

Heed Traffic Signals for Safety--CHP

Heed traffic signs and signals if you want to avoid traffic troubles warns the California Highway Patrol.

"Traffic signs and signals are definite aids to safe driving if they are obeyed," stated Patrol Commissioner B. R. Caldwell. "Drivers who habitually 'fudge' a little by slipping through a stop sign controlled intersection, jump traffic lights, keep the speed well above the posted limit in controlled areas and otherwise disregard traffic signs are frequently involved in traffic incidents and accidents.

"Traffic signs are the result of studies showing a need for some type of control or direction to avoid congestion or potential accident situations," Caldwell said. "The patrol enforces the regulations regarding these signs and signals as a cooperative action to insure the effectiveness of these devices.

"Drivers and pedestrians are urged to be alert for traffic signs and signals and prepared to obey them," he continued. "Proper respect for these safety aids will help keep traffic moving freely and with less possibility of accident."
