Each bid must be submitted on a printed form furnished by the Board of Education, must be sealed and filed in the business office on or before Friday, March 25, 1958, at 10:00 a.m. and will be opened in public at that time and place and each bid aggregating \$1,000 or over, must be accompanied by a certified or cashier's check for not less than 5% of the total amount of the bid; provided that if only certain items of a bid are accepted, the bidder may thereupon substitute a certified or cashier's check for 5% of the aggregate amount of the accepted items on his bid, and providing further that firms doing business regularly with the Board of Education may at the discretion of the Business Office and in lieu of the above mentioned check, file with the Business Office of the Torrance Unified School District, an annual or continuing surety company's bond in the sum not less than \$5,000.00 to insure compliance with the terms of their signed bids submitted from time to time during the life of the bond.

The above mentioned check or bidder's bond shall be given as a guarantee that the bidder will comply with the terms of his signed bid, and if the successful bidder fails to comply with the terms of signed bid, after acceptance thereof by the Board, his check or bond will be forfeited.

Preference shall be given to supplies, materials or equipment produced, manufactured or grown in the State of California.

The Board reserves the right to reject any and all bids, or any part of a bid, and to waive any informality in the bids received.

Bartlett Opens Campaign for 9th Re-election

Thirty-six years ago next April, a young cost accountant at the Union Tool Company (predecessor to the National Supply Co.) was elected to serve as the city clerk of the newly incorporated city of Torrance.

Today, by way of celebrating that election, City Clerk A. H. Bartlett opened his campaign for election to his 10th term in the office at the April 8 municipal election in Torrance.

The veteran city clerk came to Torrance in 1912 as a private building inspector for J. S.

Torrance, founder of the city. Later he joined Union Tool as a cost accountant and remained there until his election as city clerk in 1922.

During his early years in Torrance, Bartlett was active in many organizations, and was instrumental in helping found the Torrance Chamber of Commerce. He founded the Torrance General Insurance Agency (still in business), was one of the original organizers for the Torrance Fire Department, Torrance Athletic Assn., and the Torrance home guard.

He was charter member in both the Torrance Lions Club and Kiwanis Club, is a past governor of the Moose Lodge 785, a member of the Torrance Masonic Lodge 447, Southern California City Clerk's Assn., and a former secretary of the United Assn. of Pipefitters and Steamfitters.

In 1952 he received a citation for outstanding service in behalf of Disabled Veterans and for assisting Disabled Veterans who were injured in the war in defense of their country.

"My platform has always been honesty, efficiency, economy, cooperation, and service to the public, citizens and the taxpayers of the city of Torrance," Bartlett said.
