**ORDINANCE NO. 952**  
**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE REPEALING CHAPTER 31 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE, 1954, AND SUBSTITUTING A NEW CHAPTER THEREFOR ENTITLED "CASTING OF SOUND OVER THE PUBLIC STREETS."**

The City Council of the City of Torrance does ordain as follows:

**SECTION 1.**  
 That Chapter 31 of "The Code of the City of Torrance, 1954" is hereby repealed and a new Chapter 31 entitled "Casting of Sound Over the Public Streets" is substituted therefor to read in its entirety as follows:

**Section 31.1. Permit required.**  
 No person shall use, operate or permit to be played, used or operated any radio, receiving set, musical instrument, phonograph, loud speaker, sound amplifier, or other machine or device for the producing or reproducing of sound which is cast over or upon the public streets for the purpose of commercial advertising or attracting the attention of the public to any building, structure, or vehicle without having received a permit therefor from the license inspector.

**Section 31.2—Sound permit board.**  
 (a) The sound permit board is hereby created to review applications when a permit is denied by the license inspector.  
 (b) The sound permit board shall be composed of the chief of police, the license inspector, and a third member designated by the city manager.  
 (c) The chief of police may designate an assistant or deputy sergeant or higher to serve in his place and stead.  
 (d) The license inspector may designate an assistant or deputy license inspector to serve in his place and stead.

**Section 31.3. Application.**  
 Application for a sound permit shall be made to the license inspector and shall be accompanied by a fee of five dollars plus one dollar per day for each location or each vehicle used. Such applications shall be secured prior to operation of any sound equipment.

**Section 31.4. Sound prohibited at night and near hospitals.**  
 No sound for which such permit is required shall be produced or reproduced between the hours of 9:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m. or within two hundred feet of any hospital, unless permission therefor has been obtained from the sound permit board.

**Section 31.5. Restrictions on issuance of license.**  
 (a) The license inspector or the sound permit board may deny the

issuance of a permit if it is determined that its issuance:  
 (1) Would be detrimental to the public health, safety or welfare, or  
 (2) Would be materially detrimental to the property of other persons located in the vicinity, or  
 (3) Will substantially interfere with the peace and quiet of the neighborhood or the community.  
 (b) The license inspector or the sound permit board may impose such conditions on the operation to be conducted under the permit as they deem necessary or proper.

**SECTION 2.**  
 Any provision of the Torrance City Code, or appendices thereto, inconsistent herewith, to the extent of such inconsistency and no further, are hereby repealed.

**SECTION 3.**  
 Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be subject to a fine not exceeding five hundred dollars (\$500.00), or six (6) months in the County Jail of Los Angeles County, or by both such fine and imprisonment, in the discretion of the Court.

**SECTION 4.**  
 This ordinance shall take effect thirty days after the date of its adoption and prior to the expiration of fifteen days from the passage thereof shall be published at least once in the Torrance Herald, a semi-weekly newspaper of general circulation, published and circulated in the City of Torrance.

**ORDINANCE NO. 948**  
**AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE AMENDING APPENDIX I OF "THE CODE OF THE CITY OF TORRANCE, 1954" (ADOPTED BY ORDINANCE NO. 781, RECLASSIFYING THAT CERTAIN PROPERTY DESCRIBED IN PLANNING COMMISSION CASE NO. 47)**

WHEREAS, The City Council deems that it is in the public interest that certain changes in classification be made in that portion of the City of Torrance as hereinafter described in Section 3; and  
 WHEREAS, due and legal publication of notice has been given to the owners of the property in the vicinity and public hearings have been held and regularly held all as required by Appendix I of "The Code of the City of Torrance, 1954", as amended, and the status of the State of California, and that opportunity has been afforded in interested parties, is therein provided, to protest the proposed Change of Zone before the Planning Commission and the City Council of the City of Torrance and that hearings on the applications have been held as required by Appendix I of "The Code of the City of Torrance, 1954", as amended, and the status of the State of California.

**SECTION 2.**  
 That said Change of Zone reclassifying and changing the use of said property heretofore described and more particularly indicated on the map marked Exhibit "A", known as the Land Use Map, which is an exhibit to and by reference made a part

of Appendix I of "The Code of the City of Torrance, 1954", as amended, and which is on file in the office of the City Engineer, be and the same is hereby approved; and the said Land Use Map of the City of Torrance is hereby amended to show such reclassification and zoning; and the portion of said Map as amended and hereto attached, is hereby made a part of said Land Use Map of the City of Torrance and is hereby substituted for the portion of the original Land Use Map covering the property herein reclassified.

**SECTION 3.**  
 That the property to be reclassified is described as follows:  
 All of Tract 2269, situated West of Arlington, Northerly of 182nd Street and Southerly of 178th Street in the City of Torrance, per map recorded in Book 589, Pages 1 and 2 of Maps, on June 18, 1956 in the office of the County Recorder of Los Angeles County, State of California.

**SECTION 4.**  
 That said property described in Section 3, be, and the same is hereby reclassified from C-2 (General Commercial) to R-1 (Single Family Residential).

**SECTION 5.**  
 That said Change of Zone is approved for the purpose of making the best possible use of this parcel of land.
