**Blount Seeking Confidence Vote In City Election**

Seeking a vote of confidence at the April 8 election is Willys G. Blount, a member of the city council since 1950.

Born in San Augustine, Tex., in 1916, he attended Texas A & M College and Pacific Coast University of Law. He moved to Torrance in 1948 where he took up residence on Wilkie Ave. in north Torrance. He now resides at 1444 El Prado with his wife, Margaret, and three children, Mary Margaret, 16, Anna Beth, 12, and John Franklin, 7. He is a member of the First Methodist Church of Torrance, Torrance Lodge 447 F & A M, Redondo Chapter 101 of Royal Arch Masons, Golden West Commandry No. 43, Knight's Templar, and Al Malaikah Temple are handicapped by not being ber of the Torrance Rotary Club, and is employed by Kirkhill Rubber Co. as a sales engineer, servicing California's industrial and aircraft firms for his firm.

The city manager form of government finds a strong supporter in Blount, and he states his belief that the city has made spectacular progress as a result of its efficient administration.

"This progress should not be impeded by power-seeking individuals," he said.

"I am convinced that the laws, rules, and regulations set out by the city of Torrance should be fairly and impartially applied to all the citizens of the city without thought of personal gain or prejudice," he states.

"Civil service employees of the city are doing an excellent job and the shorthanded departments have gone far beyond the call of duty on many occasions," he added.

With the experience of two full terms in office and with the earnest desire to serve all the people of the city, Blount pledges his continued efforts "to see that the governing policy of the city is determined by all of its elected officials, and not by the dictatorial whims of a small clique."
