Local Cabbie Held Up by Bandit Trio

A Torrance cab driver was forced to hand over his wallet at gun point Sunday morning, according to Lennox sheriff's deputies.

Eugene Gather, 27, of 1806 Torrance Blvd., told deputies that three men who were riding as passengers in the cab told him to drive to their car which had run out of gas in the Palos Verdes Hills.

As they approached a parked car, one of the men drew an automatic pistol and threatened to shoot if he did not hand over his wallet, Gather declared.

Taking the money from the wallet, the men fled to the waiting car in which another man was sitting, the cab driver reported.

Gather, who said he picked the trio up in Lomita, told officers the stickup men took the ignition keys from his cab before they left.

Coleman Occupies Torrance Facility

Coleman Engineering Co., Inc., started business yesterday in its new manufacturing, administrative, research and development facilities at 3500 Torrance Blvd.

The plant, consisting of an administrative - engineering building and a research and development laboratory building, was designed and constructed by the William J. Moran Co., Los Angeles.

The new facility, owned by the Del Amo Estate Co., was built at a cost of \$900,000 and was especially planned to handle Coleman's diversified activity. The Coleman units are the first group of a research and development industrial park in Torrance zoned exclusively for such projects.

"I talked it over with my dog and he told me he doesn't want to be shot."
"I wonder if this WOULD-BE COMEDIAN took the trouble to ask any children if they wanted to be bitten by a rabid dog?"

Fortunately for all, and especially for our children, who are the most common victims of rabid dog attacks, the inoculation ordinance was passed and is now law. We have had no cases of rabies in our community since. Recently, the State of California adopted similar humanitarian laws.
