Railroads Need Diversification, Civilians Told

Less government regulations and more freedom to diversify their services are what the railroads ask of Congress this year to enable them to move ahead with improved transportation, members of the Torrance Civitan Club were told at a recent dinner meeting.

C. E. Leahy, public relations representative of the Southern Pacific, said in a talk on "Grooming the Iron Horse," that the industry seeks "no handout," but does ask relief from long outdated federal regulations.

Greatest single need of the railroads is permission to diversify as other modern business do and thus to offer the customer an integrated transportation service which the law now forbids, he said.

Another major need of the industry, Leahy said, is to modernize its labor agreement, many of which date from World War I days and fail to recognize changed conditions 40 years later. Recent studies show that "make work" rules are costing the industry and its customers more than \$500 million annually, he said.
