Therapy Pool Drive Hits \$40,000 Mark

Charles Soderstrom, campaign chairman of the Harbor Area Therapy Unit for Handicapped Children, Inc., announced this week a total of over \$40,000 has been raised to date towards the goal of \$65,000.

Included in this figure are cash donations totaling \$24,708.69; pledges amounting to \$820; and \$15,000 worth of material contributed.

Upon completion the pool

will service physically handicapped children at the Harlan Shoemaker school from Torrance, Dominguez, Wilmington, Harbor City, Lomita, Gardena and San Pedro.

DURING the past week a \$5000 hydraulic hoist was donated to the therapy pool committee by the Kiwanis Club of San Pedro and \$1000 worth of lumber was donated by the Sun Lumber Co. of San Pedro.

Volunteering to build the unit was the Building Contractors Assn. of the Harbor Area, headed by Bob Dunn of Wilmington.

Most recent benefit presented by the special activities committee, headed by Al Moe, was a fashion show Monday at Henry's Yacht Landing, Wilmington. Mrs. Mae Specht was fashion show chairman.

Forthcoming fund-raising projects include a show to be held at the Granada Theater in Wilmington by the Civitan

Club; a show at the Strand Theater in San Pedro by the San Pedro Civitan Club; and a rummage sale in San Pedro under the leadership of Ina Alford.






