ITALIAN CHICKEN

1 to 3 lbs frying chicken 1/2 tsp. salt
(cut up) Pepper
Fat for frying 1 10-oz can spaghetti sauce
Heat oven to 375 degrees. Wash and dry chicken. Brown on both sides in hot fat in a heavy skillet. Place in a 2 qt. casserole. Sprinkle with salt and pepper. Pour meat sauce over chicken. Cover and bake about one hour or until tender. Makes four servings.

MOLDED GELATIN SALAD

3 pkg. lime jello 1 cup mayonnaise
1 lg. carton cottage cheese 1 lg. can crushed pineapple
Dissolve the jello using some of the pineapple juice for the liquid. Let it set until slightly thickened and then whip. Mix cottage cheese, mayonnaise and pineapple. Fold into the whipped jello. Let stand until firm.
